



Connecting young people with the natural world and encouraging healthy lifestyles is our passion. Since 1996, we have established and maintained a reputation for excellence in our unique, educational outdoor programs based in Taos Ski Valley and beyond. Our programs continue to grow and now include summer day camps, camping and backpacking trips, school environmental education programs, after-school cycling programs, free youth mountain biking (Trips For Kids-Taos), an inclusive, family-oriented cycling team (Team FITaos), and FIT Neighborhood camp.

By offering positive, healthy opportunities for experiencing hands-on nature studies and outdoor skills development, our programs help youth build self-esteem and use teamwork while exploring the outdoors. In 2014 we offered more programs than ever throughout the year with a staff of over 40 including Lead Instructors, Junior Counselors and Counselors in Training.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Summer Mountain Camps: 97/231 or 42% of total kids totaling \$17,000+ in scholarship funds in 2014 Many additional scholarships and small grants were given to individuals and to school programs.

2014 FITAOS PROGRAM SUMMARY

SUMMER CAMPS

Mountain Camps Based in Taos Ski Valley since 1996, these camps serve youth entering first grade and up. The focus is on active, hands-on learning experiences. Throughout each session, we integrate different themes (archaeology, river ecology, wildlife biology, orienteering, etc.) while exploring our surroundings through hikes, activities, and games. Observation, teamwork, and problem solving skills are developed in an exciting, fun, and creative outdoor learning environment. 231 individual youth participated in one and two week day camps, backpacking trips, extended camping trips, and mountain bike adventures. We operated at or near full capacity June 2-August 14, 2014. This was well over 1200 "camper days" with some participating in multiple sessions.

FIT Neighborhood Camp This summer program operates Monday-Friday at Quail Ridge Taos and is an engaging, active and fun way for kids ages 5-12 to spend summer days in a supervised, structured environment. Activities include swimming, tennis, group games, and crafts. FIT Neighborhood believes in fun, teamwork, mentorship, and creativity and welcomes weekly enrollment as well as daily drop-ins. Youth Leadership Our Youth Leadership programs have grown and now allow us to employ many young people ages 10 and up as interns and volunteers. This mentorship component of Field Institute of Taos is a vital aspect of our vision. We hire both Counselors In Training (volunteers) and Junior Counselors (paid interns) to work in all aspects of our summer programs as well as in our after school programs. In 2014 there were 43 staff members including 14 Junior Counselors, 17 Counselors In Training, and 12 Lead Instructors. http://www.fitaos.org/who-we-are/youth-leaders/

Team FITaos Cycling This unique team spans all ages and abilities. Team FITaos promotes cycling in the Taos area while developing the abilities of local athletes. Through training and competition, Team FITaos provides a fun, supportive environment focused on mentoring youth, families, and individuals. The 2014 Team had over 50 Taos area youth and adults. In 2014, we hosted 5 Hill Climb Events on Taos Ski Valley Road for all ages and abilities as well as weekly junior mountain bike rides and women's rides.

FITaos Edventures This innovative program gives students and teachers of Taos area schools a unique experience bridging the classroom and the natural world in an outdoor setting. Diverse lessons are conducted utilizing multiple learning methods enabling students to participate in active hands-on activities. Students (among their peers) embrace concepts of environmental and social matters with more depth.
