Tree Buds opening	Male house finches sport new red feathers	Rain Falls! (not snow) 	Flies! 	Rio Grande Water Rising 
Dew (not frost) on ground in morning	Magpie Courtship Rituals (males carrying sticks to nest)	I see a bee!	EIK fur clumps found (from shedding winter coats)	Mountain bluebirds or red-winged blackbirds spotted
Snake Sighting	Day and night are equal length	Spring Winds 	Bootes and Virgo constellation seen at night.	EIK sightings in higher elevations (8,000-9,000 feet)
Tulip leaves sprouting	Red-tailed Hawk Courtship display	Daffodil and dandelion leaves emerging	Aspen + Cottonwood Catkins start poppin'! 	Water level in creeks rise (as snow melts)
Humming Birds Return 	Acequias start flowing	Herbaceous (non-woody) plants appear greener	Ants emerge from their underground nests	Songbirds Chirping + Singing in the mornings
